To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is to bespeak my personal acquaintance with Dr. Wilhelm Wadler and to introduce him to others to whom he may present this letter.

Dr. Wadler is a physician who is a specialist in health propaganda. His most effective work has been done through the medium of hygienic museums. He has worked in Dusseldorf and he was responsible for the establishment of two sections - one of which is on Tuberculosis - in the permanent Museum of Hygiene at Dresden.

I am personally familiar with Dr. Wadler's work through his exhibit on medicine and hygiene prepared for the Ministry of Hygiene of the Turkish Government on the occasion of the last Medical Congress held in Ankara in 1935. This was a most effective piece of work and demonstrated an unusual flair for artistry, for its application to medical subjects and for effective pictorial presentation. Comments both in professional circles and in the press were highly complimentary of Dr. Wadler's work at that time and the popular appeal was surprisingly wide.

It is unusual indeed to find within the ranks of the medical profession an individual who devotes himself to an artistic speciality of this sort. It is to be hoped that Dr. Wadler's talents may be put to advantageous use. I should not hesitate to recommend him to any person or organisation interested in the type of work in which he specialises.
